### WORKSHOP ONE

## INDUSTRIAL SEWING

This workshop is designed to upskill students from a domestic machine background to confidently using industrial machines (automatic straight sewers and overlockers).

The workshop teaches students how to use and handle industrial sewing machines and then to manufacture a garment using those machines.

Timeframe : 3x Fridays  
9:30 am - 2:30pm per day

Unit Standard: 17817 (level 3, 6 credits)  
"Assemble and sew a complete garment from cut components"

Pre-requisites : Ability to sew a complete simple garment

### WORKSHOP TWO

## PATTERN MAKING

This workshop is for students who can sew. Students gain sufficient knowledge to enable them to draft two body blocks using industry terminology, tools and methods. In order to complete the requirements of the Unit Standard students must complete construction of a toile for each block (this can be completed in school under teacher supervision if the student fails to complete it within the timeframe with us).

Unit Standard: 13387 (level 3, 6 credits)  
"Construct pattern blocks for women's wear"

Pre-requisites : Students must be able to sew a complete garment
